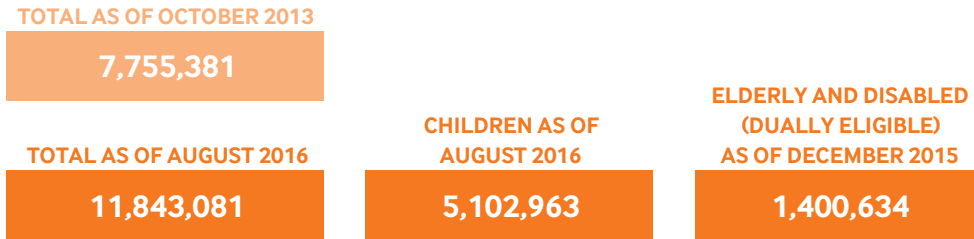


MEDICAID: What It Brings to California

Improved Access to Health Care

Medicaid provided health care coverage to 11,843,081 adults and children in California, an increase of 4,087,700 since 2013.

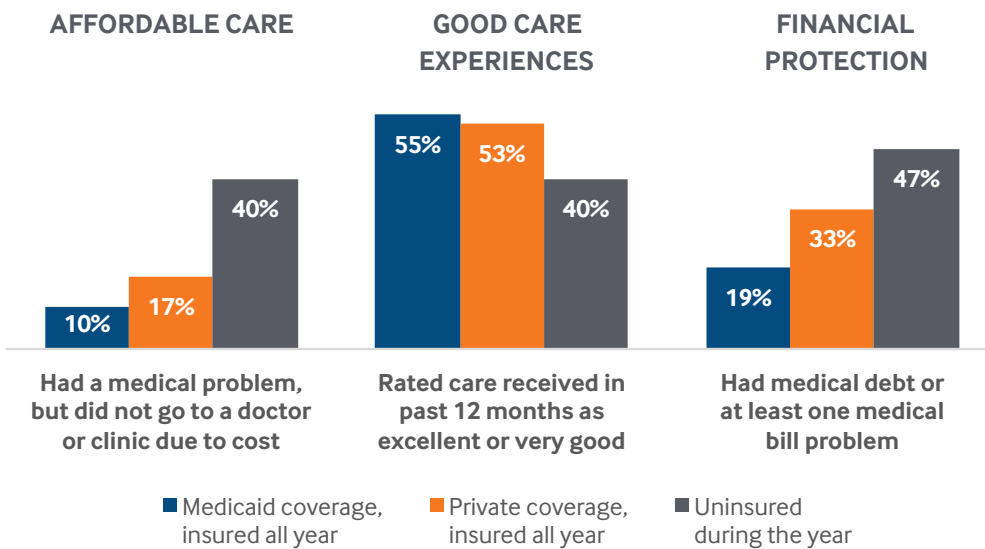
Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) Enrollment

Losing Medicaid would make it hard for people to get health care, and increase their risk of medical debt if they were to get sick.

Federal Dollars and Jobs

The federal government provided \$53 billion or 63% of the funding for people covered by Medicaid in California.

Reduced Medicaid funding would mean that hospitals would have to absorb a lot of the cost of care for uninsured people.

Losing federal dollars would also impact states' economies. A repeal of the Affordable Care Act's Medicaid expansion alone could lead to a loss of 240,000 jobs in California in 2019.
